New Trees



In April, 107 trees were planted at the Ysgol Gymraeg by parents, children and helpers. Regular watering during the dry spell resulted in good survival. The Cambrian News printed details and a photo. Some old stakes and tree tubes were donated by the Woodland Trust and the only expense for GAG was tree ties.

We are delighted to see the new trees planted in North Parade. They replace those that had died in recent years. Also, three new street trees were planted in Queen's Road - but, sadly, one has already been destroyed by vandals.

GAG has developed ideas for more planting along Boulevard St Briec, and has taken an opportunity to comment on the planting proposals for the new Welsh Assembly Government and Ceredigion County Council office sites.

GAG Developments

Ideas wanted for outdoor events

Already under consideration are a walk to discuss street trees in the town (gentle, short walk) and a geological walk (more energetic). And what would interest children? Some members have kindly volunteered to help with various tasks. Apologies to those who have not been contacted yet but your offers have not been forgotten.

Plas Crug Ditch

For the last 15 months (since April 2006) volunteers have been making almost weekly collections of rubbish from Plas Crug ditch, which at peak periods accumulates flotsam almost every day. Constant attention is needed if we are to maintain the Avenue as a delightful traffic-free, peaceful environment for residents and visitors wishing to spend a few moments in quiet contemplation.

We kept accurate records of the items we collected, which were both varied and surprising, as follows:- large plastic bags (247), drink cans (131), plastic/glass bottles (177), and balls (36) together with a large number of miscellaneous items which included four traffic bollards, five Supermarket catalogues, shopping trolleys, three child bicycles, car wheel, bottle crate, and numerous crisp packets. On the positive side, we also recorded a pair of Mallard and a Kingfisher on several occasions, and possibly water vole.
