Trees Now Growing



On a hot day at Easter 2007, volunteers from GAG and parents planted over 100 trees at Ysgol Gymraeg. The trees were a donation from local man Andy Cairns and consisted of a mixture of Ash, Oak and Beech. The trees are still doing well, with only three trees having to be removed. They will undoubtedly look at their best in a few years. A great success story!



Plas Crug Trees Vandalised

GAG volunteers have made a survey to accurately map and identify all the trees in Plas Crug Avenue. There are a few unusual species e.g. a tulip tree. Soon after the survey started a small birch was vandalised and had to be removed. Later, six of the thirty new trees planted by the Council near the playground were broken off. The County Council intends to replant them.

Habitat Survey

With grant aid from the Countryside Council for Wales GAG commissioned Environment Systems Ltd (Science Park, Cefn Llan) to carry out a habitat survey to identify all the different types of green space in and around Aberystwyth. For the first time it is possible to quantify the extent of, for example, woodland or amenity grassland. The full results were collated and have been made available to the County Council to assist in the preparation of the forthcoming Local Development Plan.

Planning

GAG continues to monitor all planning applications which may affect greenspaces and to send observations to the County Council as appropriate. It appears that the latest development in Infirmary Road, which GAG opposed, was started in contravention of several conditions set out in the planning approval. The Planning Officer has been informed and we await news of what action the Council will take.



GAG members attended a site meeting at Bronpadarn on 26.9.08 to discuss the planning application to convert a Victorian outbuilding and greenhouses into a dwelling. Concern was expressed at this encroachment into a much-valued woodland and the threat to trees, notably the large ginkgo. Cemetery

In February a plan to carry out drastic pruning of the tunnel of trees inside the main cemetery gate was halted by the intervention of GAG members. GAG is now working with the County Council to produce a management plan for the long-term future of trees and shrubs in the cemetery.

Bird notes

A Little Egret was seen on Blaendolau playing fields in early January. Possibly the same bird was also in Plascrug ditch and Vicarage fields from 15th -17th January with 2 there on 17th. A kingfisher frequented Plascrug ditch in February. Black Redstarts were seen around the harbour, the castle, Old College and the National Library between January and March. (Information from Ceredigion Bird Recorder's monthly report). More recently, Mediterranean Gull (26.8.08) and Grey Phalarope (9.9.08) were seen. Source: www.birdguides.com/sites.
