Trees lost in Park Avenue



Four trees in Park Avenue which were planted by the county council on council-owned land in front of the proposed Aldi site were removed. The original planning application, which was granted outline permission, did not include the area in front of the blue hoarding (see 1st photo). It showed the trees as being left intact. In the summer of 2020, the hoarding was moved forward to the pavement (see 2nd photo) and the original trees were destroyed.

More recently, replacement trees have been planted, but are at the moment hidden by the fence.



Further along the road, trees and shrubs were destroyed in late 2023 in the retail park by Morrison's roundabout. These acted as a good screen from the shops and provided a good pollution filter from the traffic. They also contributed to the greening of the Aberystwyth approach road, in which the Coed Aber

planting scheme played a major part. This "Green Welcome" effect is being steadily lost.

GAG has emailed the developers voicing concern and asking what plans they have. No acknowledgement has been received.

Trees planted near Ysgol Penweddig



Beside the cycle route/path from Llanbadarn to Plas Crug, a triangle of ground has been planted with young trees. This area has now been tidied up and grass removed from the protective tree tubes to free the saplings from competition. They all look healthy.

Coed Aber



Some of the trees along Park Avenue and Boulevard de Saint-Brieuc need their labels replaced. The Town Council is applying for a grant to cover the cost, and GAG will be involved in the design and fitting of the new labels. Tree planting in Llanbadarn



Llanbadarn Fawr Community Council has been accepted onto the Woodland Trust Community planting scheme and has received a range of tree saplings to be planted on the community playing field. The scheme is intended to allow everyone to have a chance to plant a tree to fight the effects of climate change and to help reach the 2050 carbon net-zero target.

A Community planting session was held in April. The trees are being planted around the borders of the field, together with a new boundary fence, which is being installed with grant support from Ceredigion County Council and assistance from Vince Morgans of Llety Parc.

Grass cutting



Grass cutting in many areas in Aberystwyth is now restricted to the edges, leaving a central area of longer grass in which wild flowers can flourish. This gives valuable help to pollinators such as bees and butterflies.

We can all help wildlife by joining Plantlife's *NoMowMay* movement and leaving grass uncut.

A healthy lawn with some long grass and wildflowers benefits wildlife, tackles pollution and can even lock away carbon below ground. With over 20 million gardens in the UK, even the smallest grassy patches add up to a significant

proportion of our land which, if managed properly, can deliver enormous gains for nature, communities and the climate.
