Rare Moss Found

On a visit to Aberystwyth last year, Dr Sam Bosanquet, a botanist from the Countryside Council for Wales who specialises in mosses, was amazed to find a colony of Blunt-leaved Bristle-moss (*Orthotrichum obtusifolium*) on a tree in Plascrug Avenue. The species had never been found before



in Wales and it is listed as *Endangered* in the British Red Book of rare plants. Dr Bosanquet reported that this moss was relatively widespread in the English Midlands until about 1920, but was thought to have become almost extinct as a result of air pollution and Dutch Elm Disease. It was believed that a few colonies on a tree in north-east Scotland were the sole survivors until the moss was found on a Bramley Apple tree in Cambridgeshire in 2007. Dr Bosanquet stressed that the Aberystwyth find needs to be looked after so that in time it will be able to spread to other trees in this green heart of our town

Tree Planting Schemes

From time to time GAG has promoted ideas for tree planting around the town. Prompted by the potential impact of developments taking place in the lower Rheidol valley GAG has recently joined forces with the Cardiganshire Horticultural Society to pool ideas and expertise. The first joint initiative aims to promote a coordinated planting plan for the approach road from the Parcyllyn roundabout to the town centre: identified in the Aberystwyth Masterplan as a priority area for high-quality landscaping.

Woodlands for Wales Strategy

GAG has submitted comments on the Welsh Assembly Government's consultation paper on a revised strategy for Welsh woodlands. The references to the importance of trees and woodland in urban areas were warmly welcomed

Inventory Report

A meeting was held recently between representatives of GAG, Ceredigion County Council and the Countryside Council for Wales to discuss how the Report on Aberystwyth Green Spaces commissioned by GAG earlier this year might be used by the two other organisations

Planning Applications

Ceredigion Planning Committee has recently imposed strict conditions to protect trees on developments at Penglais and Bronpadarn. GAG members are monitoring both situations to try to ensure that these restrictions are honoured.

Plascrug Avenue and Stream

Two trees overhanging Plascrug school grounds were felled recently, following consultation with GAG. Further consultation is anticipated on other tree management work. Volunteers from GAG continue to remove rubbish from the Plascrug stream on a regular basis. Since GAG was formed, hundreds of balls, plastic bottles, bags and crisp packets have been extracted, in addition to the more occasional shopping trolley and bicycle. The improvement in this attractive avenue is there for all to see. However, those with sharp eyes may be particularly rewarded by a glimpse of the iridescent blue flash of the kingfisher now seen regularly along Plascrug stream in the winter months. Mwsogl Prin yn Aberystwyth

Yn Aberystwyth y llynedd, fe synnwyd Dr Sam Bosanquet, botanegwr o Gyngor Cefn Gwlad Cymru sy'n arbenigo mewn mwsogl, wrth ffeindio clwstwr o Wrychfwsogl Pŵlddail (*Orthotrichum obtusifolium*) ar goeden ym Mhlascrug. Ni welwyd y rhywogaeth hon erioed yng Nghymru o'r blaen, ac fe restrir fel *Mewn perygl o ddiiflannu* yn y llyfr *British Red Book of rare plants*.



Yn ôl Dr Bosanquet, roedd y mwsogl hwn yn gymharol gyffredin yng Nghanolbarth Lloegr tan tua 1920, ond credir ei fod wedi marw allan bron oherwydd llygredd yr awyr a chlefyd llwydden yr Isalmaen. Fe gredwyd mai dim ond ychydig o glystyrau ar goeden yng Ngogledd-Ddwyrain yr Alban oedd ar ôl, nes cafwyd hyd i'r mwsogl ar afallen Bramley yn swydd Caergrawnt yn 2007. Pwysleisiodd Dr Bosanquet bod rhaid edrych ar ôl y darganfyddiad sydd yn Aberystwyth, fel y bydd ymhen amser yn ymledu i goed eraill yng nghanolfan werdd ein tref.
